



# IMPORTANCE OF FATHER & MALE ROLE MODEL ENGAGEMENT

• Evidence demonstrates that fathers play a critical role in children's health and development, beginning in the prenatal period and continuing through early childhood and adolescence. When fathers are involved during pregnancy, mothers are 1.5 times more likely to receive prenatal care in the first trimester. ~ National Institute of Children's Health Quality (NICHQ)




