What is a Deaf Mentor?

Snapshots D/HH Mentors

Adults who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deafblind representing the full range of hearing levels, communication choices, technology use and educational placement who will answer questions about experiences growing up with a hearing loss.

ASL Deaf Mentors

Adults who are Deaf will interact with families using ASL, provide ASL instruction, teach families about Deaf culture and introduce them to the Deaf community.
