NJ Inclusive Higher Education Program Options

"The overall goal for providing education services in post-secondary settings is to give older students with disabilities age-appropriate settings for their final public education and transition experiences."



Transition and Career Studies:

A four-year transition and postsecondary inclusive college-based program for students with intellectual disabilities ages 18-26. With a career development focus, this inclusive residential program is embedded in a small private university.



Career and Community Studies:

A four-year residential college based certificate program for young adults with intellectual disabilities 18-25. This program is designed to prepare students for adult life through academic rigor, career discovery and socialization as part of a diverse community of learners.



The Transition and Career Studies Program:

A comprehensive non-residential two-year certificate program designed to support students with intellectual disability 18-25, as they prepare for academic success, meaningful employment, and full participation in college life.



Turning Point:

A two-year transition and postsecondary inclusive college-based non-residential program for students with intellectual disabilities ages 18-30.
